No changes in the top end of the Thorndale Team, Mat Nicholls is steering a steady path with the help of George Savill as Head Lad. He headed to the Cheltenham Festival as favourite for the Northern Trust Company Novices' Handicap Chase and duly bolted up in the style of a very smart horse, jumping and galloping like the winner from a long way out and never looking likely to be beaten. We have always had a high opinion of him and it was great to see that vindicated in such good style. He has many options this winter and will have an entry in the BetVictor Gold Cup at Cheltenham in November although he could go straight into graded company.
