Celebrating Grade 1 Glory

We must look back on 2020/2021 as the season when the World really did go mad. This time last year we were wondering if racing would survive Covid or whether we would also survive, but both did.

Firstly, the BHA played a blinder and managed to persuade the Government that racing was an essential sport and needed to keep going. Going it did and it was a wet one, it was one we all pulled through, although at times it was probably far more difficult for owners and racegoers than those working in the sport. No owners and no crowds made for a very odd days racing, so yes, we can look back on the last 12 months and say never again, although we certainly will not forget the 2020/2021 season.

Headlines were made at Ascot when First Flow won the Clarence House Chase, our first Grade 1 since the heady days of Master Oats and Alderbrook. It was a huge result for the yard and for my longest serving owner Tony Solomons who was unable to celebrate the success with me, we would have enjoyed sharing a bottle of water!! Thanks to some excellent coverage from ITV racing, we all became armchair pundits and David Bass went into many people's notebooks as a 'young' rider to follow after several front running and daring rides on our horses; the public lapped up the story of David and our horses.

Our season started last July with Yeavering Belle winning at Bangor and ended with Younevercall winning at Sandown and in between we had some memorable moments. Happygolucky's second at the Cheltenham Festival (a position we hate to finish in) but he made up for it by winning at Aintree. Imperial Aura jumped for fun around Carlisle and Ascot and then things went astray at Cheltenham, but he will be a better horse this time. El Presente had a cracking season and his win in the Badger Beer Chase at Wincanton was one to savour. Ajero, a half-brother to Charbel, won four on the bounce over hurdles. Rocky's Treasure shocked us when winning a good televised race at Doncaster. Espoir de Romay showed what he is capable of and if only he had not fallen at Aintree, could so easily have

added another Grade 1 to our honours list. **Flirtatious Girl** won the prestigious Mares Listed Bumper at Sandown, a race we won some years ago with **Molly's A Diva** whose first offspring **I Spy A Diva** won her only start in a bumper at Worcester in April. The Edgar Wallace ended his season by winning at Uttoxeter after some good, placed runs.

There were of course many other horses who won and deserve mentioning but now I feel I should mention those who work so hard behind the scenes here at Thorndale. Mat Nicholls is into his 14th year at Thorndale and now a partner in KBR. Peter Kerr who manages and runs all my syndicates and without his support and patience I would be lost, I just don't know how he does it at times. Leigh Pollard continues to win more bestturned outs than most and Kate Paddock has been promoted to vard manager to assist Mat this season having been a member of the team since 2018. The long-suffering Sandie Wilkinson had more sleepless nights than I after finding out I'd invested £1m on youngsters during the summer. Maddie Webster is now into her fourth season here and is very much part of the furniture in the office, keeping us on our toes!

Lockdown took some surviving, especially if you are married to a trainer. Clare who had a shocking 2019/2020 really does deserve all my love and support. I probably would not have survived without Clare's help and on that note her help is also greatly appreciated by all here at Thorndale even, now that she is no longer allowed to ride out.

Talking riding, we have two top jockeys in David Bass and Ciaran Gethings at Thorndale who play a huge part in the day-to-day riding of our horses. David had a fabulous season and although Ciaran rode only a few winners for us, he too had a good season with winners at all the big meetings including Aintree.

We just failed to hit 60 winners but ended on 59 which at times feels like being out on 99 as statistics are everything in racing today. We finished 13th in the prize money table and 11th in the winners table with a strike rate of 19%, only bettered by three trainers in the top 30 and one of them was Irish!

We now head into another season with high hopes and some really exciting horses. We will be doing our best to make it another memorable one.


