## A reflection on our 2024/2025 season....

So much has happened over the last 12 months.

Firstly, Mat Nicholls has joined me on my licence and now we race under Kim Bailey and Mat Nicholls. It was something I promised Mat when I made it to 1500 winners and that I achieved when Chianti Classico won at Ascot.. Hurlerontheditch winning at Doncaster was to be the last under my own name. Moon Rocket winning at Southwell was our first under a joint licence. Other than the racing side of things, nothing at Thorndale has actually changed but it is a way of looking into the future.

Here is a roundup of last season:

It all started with the [KBRS Magical Escape](#) (Surprise Syndicate) winning at Ffos Las in May ridden by Ciaran Gethings. Ciaran then won on the [KBRS Parc D'Amour](#) (The Strollers) at Southwell. A couple of weeks later Gavin Sheehan won on the [KBRS Mikhailovich](#) (The Thrill Seekers) at Market Rasen. An extraordinary win as he was so far back that I felt like turning the TV off and screaming abuse.

July brought [Tregele](#) (Julie and David Martin and Dan Hall) winning at Uttoxeter with Tom Bellamy aboard. Tom was becoming more involved at Thorndale by then and he produced an excellent ride to win on [KBRS Gerard Mentor](#) (Garrett, Meacham & Woodhall) at Worcester in September..

We hit a purple patch in October starting with [KBRS El Rio](#) (Rio Grandees) winning at Huntingdon and two days later [Brendas Asking](#) (Dr David Carey - Not The Turf Club) under Nathan Andrews (his first ride for us) and [Court In A Storm](#) (Park View) winning at Ludlow. [Destroytheevidence](#) (Phil and Gill Andrews) was given a peach of a ride by Tom Bellamy at Chepstow in the race that Chianti Classico won the year before. It was after that win that Tom became our official stable jockey and he started well on day one with a treble at Worcester with [Clondaw General](#) (Phil and Gill Andrews), [Law Of Supply](#) (Andrew Lay's Legacy) and [KBRS The Kemble Brewery](#) (Breakfast at 10 Syndicate).

November. Chianti Classico (Sir Francis Brooke and Sir Richard Pilkington) carried top weight at Ascot and that was to be my 1500th winner as a trainer and then as promised, I started the process of adding Mat Nicholls to my licence. We had a double with El Rio winning impressively under Ciaran Gethings at Sandown and Tom hardly moving on The Kemble Brewery at Ffos Las. Two days later to the delight of all Hurlerontheditch (Penny Perriss) won at Lingfield.. If ever a horse and owner deserved a winner, it was Penny Perriss and her stunning Chestnut. Back at Ascot, which I have to say is one of my favourite racecourses, Law Of Supply under Johnny Burke showed how that racecourse should be jumped as a novice. Johnny was to ride another winner for us at Ludlow a couple of days later on Faerie Cutlass (Elizabeth Kellar).. In between Tom was good on Trelawne (The Real Partnership) at Haydock. We ended November with the KBRS Moon Rocket (Youneverknow Syndicate) and the KBRS Campaign Trail (Its Only Money Syndicate) winning at Doncaster. We like Donny!

December started with Johnny Burke riding Land Afar (This Horse Is For Sale Partnership) to win at Ludlow.. The KBRS Reallyntruthfully (Nothingbutthetruth Syndicate) rather surprised us by bolting up under Harry Bannister at Warwick...we like those sorts of surprises! Later in the month Salt Rock (Julie and David Martin and Dan Hall) was given a magnificent ride by Ben Jones to win at Hereford and then Hurlerontheditch won his second race of the season back at Doncaster, which was to be my last winner as a trainer.

From January 1st Mat joined me and the future of Thorndale Farm was set with a joint licence.

The new training duo of Kim Bailey and Mat Nicholls started instantly on day one when Moon Rocket won well at Southwell.. The racecourse gave Mat the trophy as a reminder of his first winner. A very happy start all round.

Salt Rock was our second winner when Tom Bellamy settled the race at Doncaster with a huge jump at the second last. El Rio again showed that he was a progressive horse when winning at Kempton.

The old boy Mr Grey Sky (Phil and Gill Andrews) showed the youngest how to win in very tough conditions at Leicester. Really truthfully won back at our lucky racecourse Doncaster in March.

Court In A Storm won his first hurdle start at Hereford in a race that he looked unlikely to win turning for home.. but he did! Brenda's Asking was to be our last winner of the season under Nathan Andrews at Ludlow. The celebrations I believe lasted more than 24 hours!!  
So, we ended with 32 winners and 53 places, which was just about the same as last year!

Like farmers we always have something to complain about. This has been a difficult season as it has been so dry for so long that running horses at times has been a bit scary. However, we look forward to the future with great excitement as we have added some lovely horses to the yard for this season.

Mat and I cannot thank our owners enough for all their support. You have been so patient and understanding, especially in the last couple of months when you so wanted your soft ground horses to run. Patience is, I am sure, a virtue and will be rewarded..

A big thanks to Charly Bond who has worked tirelessly as our Head Girl. To all my staff who suffered and laughed.. always smiling!

Leigh Pollard as always excellent at Travelling head Girl, seconded by the smiley Mirella Salome. These two ladies have produced so many 'best turned out' horses that it has become a trademark to the yard..

Peter Kerr who works tirelessly behind the scenes. Peter is here most days .. driving in from Milton Keynes is no mean feat and the patience he shows when dealing with me and Mat, and all our in-house Syndicates is extraordinary.. unflappable..

Sandie Wilkinson drives in from North of Banbury once a week to sort out our accounts and runs us with a rod of iron!

Molly Sherring is our PA and brings in loads of experience having worked for our near neighbour Fergal O'Brien.

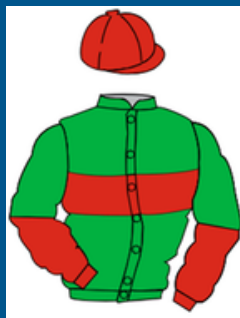
## LIST OF HORSES IN TRAINING:

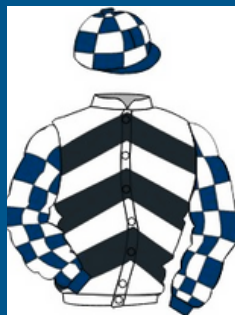


### Brendas Asking

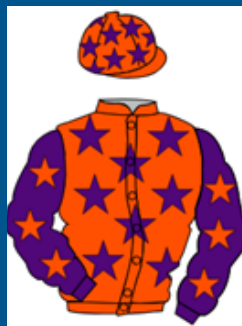

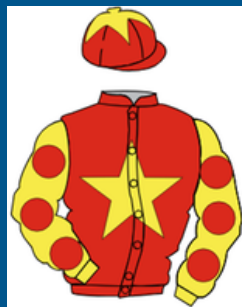


## Cask Of Pimlico

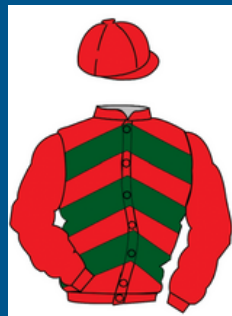

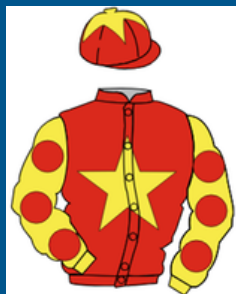


## Destroytheevidence

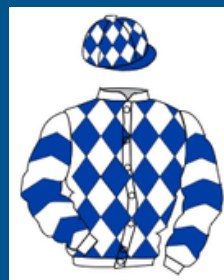

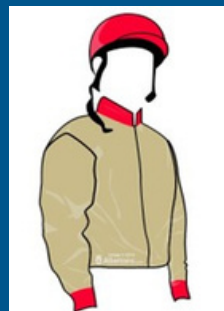


## Draco Malfoy

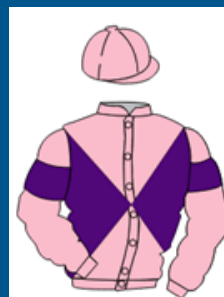


## Driving Miss D'Azy

**Owners: Rio Grandees**

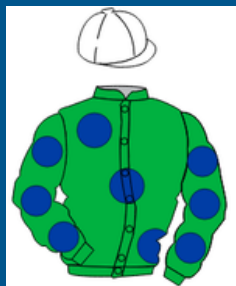

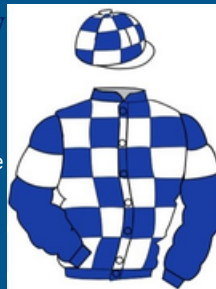


## Gatineau Park

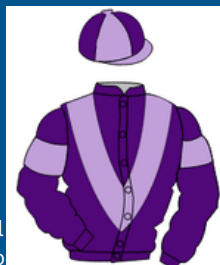

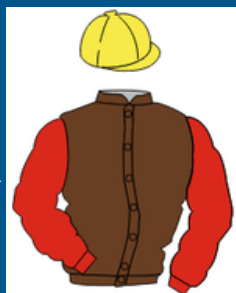


## Guchen

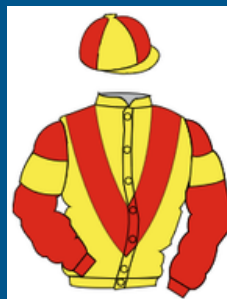


## High Tea

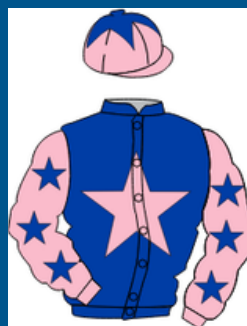


## I Spy A Diva

**Owner: Lady J. H. Parker**

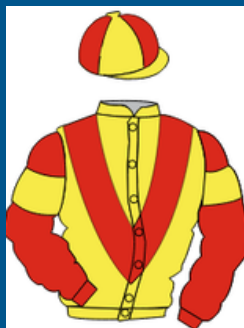

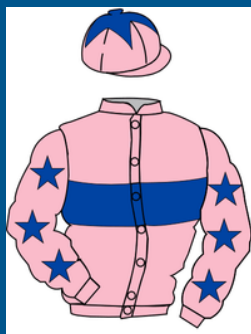


## Matty's Getaway

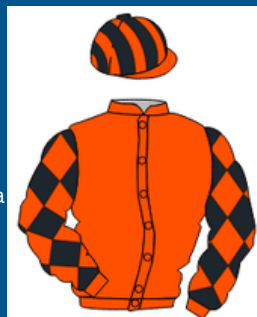

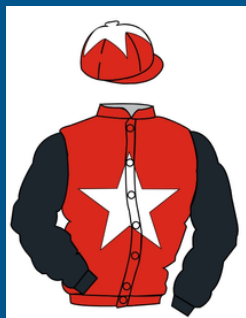


## Quad Kings

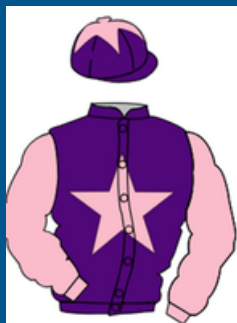

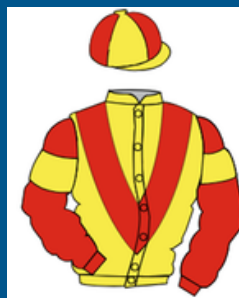


## Sogna In Grande

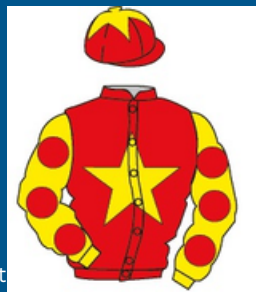

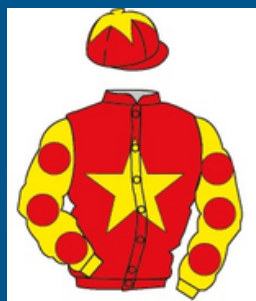


## The Edgar Wallace

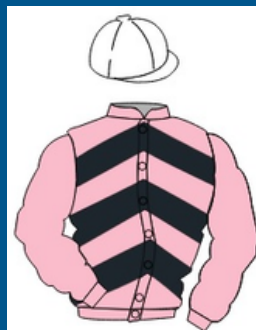


## The Kemble Brewery

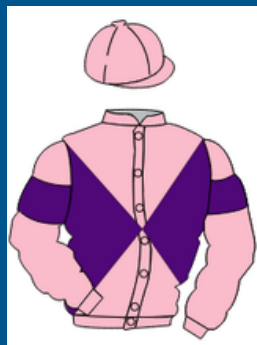

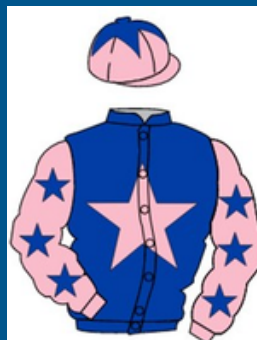


## Top Target

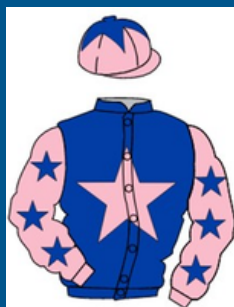

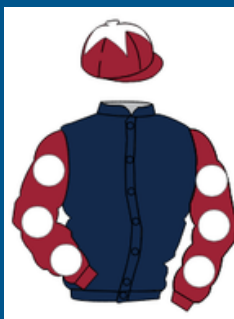


## Wild Goose
